



*The heroic witness of Kendrick Castillo demonstrates
the fullness of a life lived for others*

THERE ARE THOSE who say we don't have heroes anymore. Kendrick Castillo proves them wrong.

One day last May, Kendrick woke up as if it were any other day. An 18-year old young man, he went through his normal morning routine, packing his backpack and heading to school in a suburb of Denver. It was an exciting time for him. As a high school senior, he looked forward to his graduation – only day away – and the promising life that lay before him.

Kendrick Castillo did exactly that. A faithful Catholic to the end, he lived and died according to the teachings of Jesus Christ: "Greater

IN THE NICENE CREED, we profess: "I believe in one, holy catholic and apostolic Church." A friend of mine recently said, "I used to say those words without giving them much thought. Now, I say to myself, "I believe in the Lord. But do I believe in the Church?"

My friend speaks for quite a few people. Recent studies show that 37% of Catholics in the United States are seriously thinking about leaving the Church as the result of the sexual abuse crisis.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to spend five extra minutes sitting before the Lord before or after Sunday Mass. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action Sacramental Gifts program or pray for those receiving the sacraments, that they might choose "the better part."

A primary reason the Church canonizes saints is to inspire the faithful in their own pursuit of holiness. Knights of Columbus look to our founder and the saints for inspiration, but we also celebrate "everyday heroism" of people today

Upon returning to the U.S. after the war, Gus worked for General Dynamics for 44 years.

Gus was a dedicated parishioner at Blessed Sacrament Parish for close to 50 years. Gus was a Fourth Degree Knight in the Knights of Columbus and a Past Grand Knight of Blessed Sacrament Council #7357 and was a member of the Italian-Catholic Federation for decades.

Gus was a very dedicated and loving husband, father, grandfather, and great-grandfather to 3 children, 2 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. He was proud of his family, his accomplishments, and was always proud of his Italian roots.

Here is the full text:


